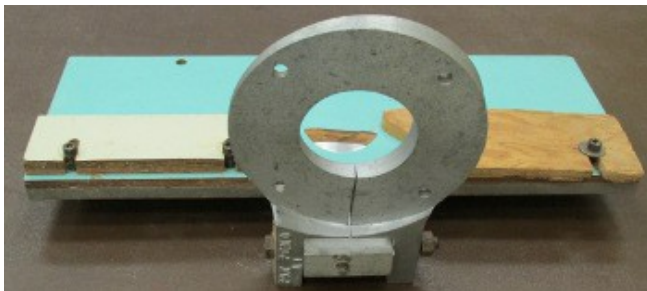

John Rhoads brought in his piano stool type table.

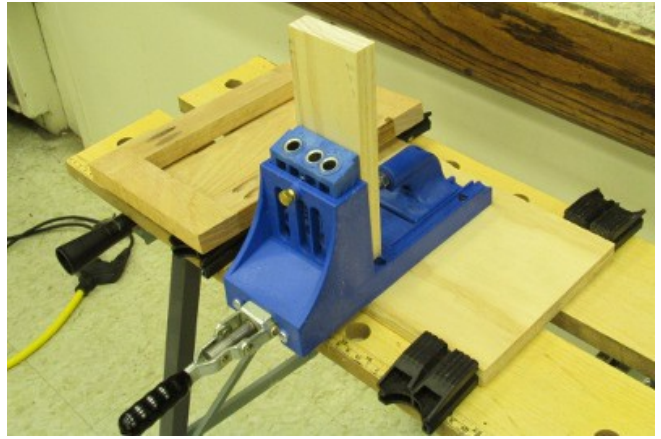

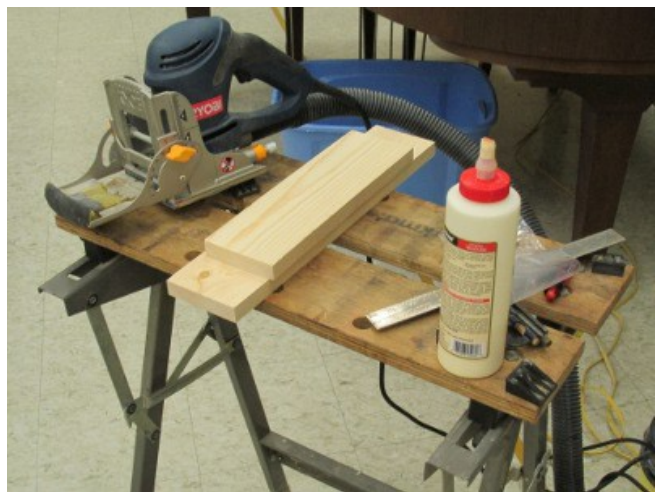




Program Jointery demonstrations

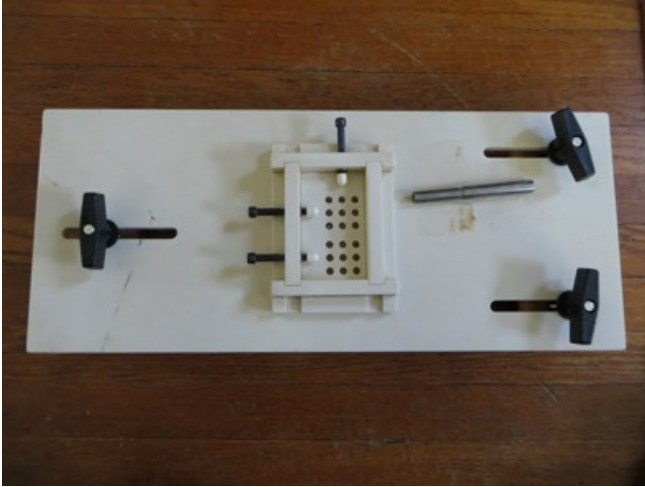
