May Meeting Program

John Rhoads will demonstrate sketching and Orthographic Projection drafting. Orthographic is a fancy word that means make flat. When applied to drawings of something that is to be built the "projection" just means that the front, top and side views are separated so that they are easier to see.

Rhoads does most of his sketching and drafting on a small drafting board with a small T-square on 8.5x11 paper. He will bring paper, some small boards and a few shop built T-squares to the meeting.

Rhoads is asking members to bring the 12 inch steal blade from a combination square and a sharpened pencil.

If you do drafting on a regular basis please bring drawings, architect or engineering scale rulers and 45 and 30-60 triangles.


