his annual trip to the Marc Adams School in Indiana.

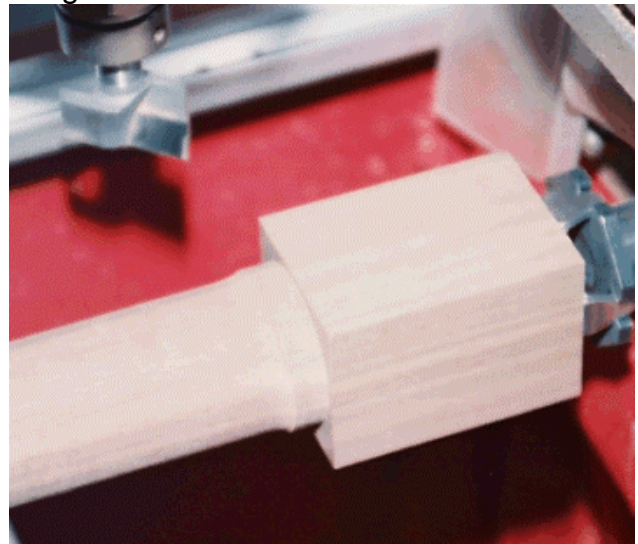
## Program-

Vice-president, Les Hastings, presented the June program – the Legacy Woodworking Ornamental mill.



Les is a professional woodworker that has a special passion for including turnings into his work pieces. He saved up all of his pennies and finally purchased a fully loaded Legacy 1800 Ornamental 3-axis mill.

This machine has the capability to mill just about anything that can fit within it's 8 foot x 12 inch bed using a router. It can follow templates, turn, turn with spirals, taper, combine features; the limitation is your imagination!



This thing has everything that a lathe has, locking dog, #2 Morse taper head and tailstocks, 1x8 threaded headstock, etc. He can repeat production runs in a greatly reduced time – and time is money when you are professional.



He showed us how he makes Barley twist legs using the power feed and spiral gear disks. Really amazing, thanks Les.

Checkout the websites for more information, Magnate makes the special geometry router bits that are used in the various shapes and methods used on this great machine.
